# The History of ADFM

The Association of Departments of Family Medicine, or ADFM was officially incorporated on April 6, 1978 when a small band of department chairs signed the Articles of Incorporation in Washington, D.C.

### Generation One (ADFM early days): chair support (1978-1998)

 ADFM's early years were typified by commiseration, support, and golf meetings of Generation One leaders, many of whom were clinicianeducators thrust into leadership roles in an emerging clinical field.

# **Generation Two: chair education (1998-2008)**

- Strategic Planning exercise in 1998
- Added professional management with the appointment of Ardis K. Davis, MSW, as Executive Director in October 2004.
- Leadership cycles were shortened
- Expanded participation by departmental senior Mentoring future chairs and developing senior leaders
- Expanded membership outreach to Large Regional Medical Centers and Osteopathic Departments of Family Medicine

#### Generation Three: leadership (2009-

- •Board's shift of attention from internal organizational topics to better address issues of critical importance to Departments, the discipline, academic medicine, and the healthcare system.
- Vision and mission process with the ADFM Board ADFM's new tagline summarizing ADFM's purpose: "Vision, Voice, Leadership".
- ADFM changes nominations and election process to single slate for President-elect, Treasurer and Secretary positions
- •ADFM Board approves first 3-year strategic plan (2012-2015)
- ADMINISTRATORS

- •ADFM Board approves second 3year Strategic Plan (2015-2018)
- ADFM Board approves 2018-19 Strategic Directions Workplan




## Snapshot of Administrators' Growth in ADFM
