



Regional Medical School with six branch campuses and more than 250 training sites in five state WWAMI region

- 270 students in each class.
- 45 students (graduating class size 249) matched into Family Medicine in 2019.

- Students paid a stipend by state academies




- Clinical immersion

WWAMI RUOP Site Map 2017












RUOP Participation 1989-2019



Who is Precepting RUOP Students? 2019 Data. Total 126




Workforce Outcomes 2004-2013 UWSOM Graduates Currently in Practice (2018) N = 1,657




UWSOM Colleges

- Currently 8 Colleges across 6 regional sites, 60
 College faculty.
- Focus is on inpatient teaching in the second year.
- Each College faculty gets 5 students each year and also provides longitudinal mentoring.

Primary Care Practicum (PCP)



- Required course in foundations phase.
- Over 300 physicians teach PCP.
- 75% are Family Physicians
- One full day every other week in the same clinic

PCP Big-Picture Goals


- Hands on opportunities to practice outpatient clinical skills and incorporate clinical reasoning





- TRUST started with a DFM HRSA grant
- DFM developed TRUST Curriculum and it continues to be overseen by DFM faculty
- CUSP Community Focused Urban Scholars Program is an urban equivalent of TRUST
- DFM funded CUSP for first two years
- CUSP was recently awarded a Hearst Foundation grant



Probability of going into Family Med



- Early clinical preceptorships can help with:
 - Fidelity of specialty choice
 - Positive role model influence
 - Curriculum that supports primary care
- Longitudinal programs are more likely to have a major impact.
- Focusing on admitting the right students is paramount; think of this as increasing pre-test probability.
